This connection enables a feeling of calmness, joy, comfort, and a sense of collectiveness which can be impactful on wellbeing and long lasting.

We are passionate about animal welfare and promote a dog-first, nature over nurture ethos, with consent to be shown from the therapy dog.

Volunteers are central to our organisation, and we highly value their time, experience, and dedication to improving the lives of others whilst advocating for their dog's welfare.

We are proud to be at the forefront of developing innovative ways to support our communities. Recently we have introduced and donated 64 robotic memory pets, set up a pet food bank, and offer employability opportunities by creating a diverse workplace as a disability confident employer.

I am interested in becoming a volunteer with my dog, what do I do next?



Thank you for showing an interest in joining our wonderful team of therapy dogs at Cariad Pet Therapy.

This document will guide you on how to start your journey in making a difference with your dog within your local community.

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN I APPLY?

INVITE TO ONLINE CHAT

After you apply via the expression of interest form on the website, you may be asked to attend a short online chat about the role where we can ask you questions about you and your dog. It is also a chance for you to ask us any questions.

We may also email you to ask further questions based on your expression of interest form before we invite you to an online chat.

The online chat can also be done over the phone or in person if you do not have access to a smart phone or pc/laptop.

INVITE TO THERAPY DOG ASSESSMENT DAY

Following the online chat, you may be invited to attend a therapy dog assessment.

What do we look for when recruiting a therapy dog?



We look for dogs that are understood as being sentient beings with rights and feelings, whose owner can always look through their eyes and advocate on their behalf.



We look for dogs that have a close bond with their owner and spend quality time engaging in activities such as exploring walks, relaxing together and socialisation within the community.

ENJOYMENT

We look for dogs that positively move forward and visibly enjoy meeting people new to them, whilst showing consideration and empathy.



We look for dogs that naturally engage and share the love, and don't need food prompts or training to do so, thus demonstrating their consent.



We look for dogs that can walk in a relaxed manner on a lead, have good social etiquette and demonstrate paws being on the floor.



We look for owners who are team players who have the time to give to volunteering which tends to be weekdays at a frequency that suits the volunteer, but we ask for a minimum commitment of once a month for a visit.



What happens at a therapy dog assessment?

HOW LONG DOES THE ASSESSMENT LAST?

You will be asked to attend a venue at a specific time. Please exercise your dog beforehand so that they have been to toilet. The therapy dog assessment will take up to 45 minutes to complete.

WHO CAN ATTEND?

Only the person who would be taking the dog on therapy dog visits is to be with the dog, so no family members, children or partners.

WHAT TYPE OF LEAD SHOULD I USE?

We prefer a dog to be on a fixed lead, so no extendable leads. We also prefer a dog to be attached by a neck collar, not a harness. If your dog will walk well on a harness then that is permitted. Please note that harnesses can prevent a dog from being smoothed in certain areas when on a visit.

WHAT HAPPENS ON THE ASSESSMENT?

We simply spend time with you and your dog. We film and confidentially store the assessment as video evidence. You will be informed before you leave as to the outcome of the assessment. Please do not bring any food, toys or treats with you.

WHO CARRIES OUT THE ASSESSMENT?

We are very friendy and relaxed in our manner and in our approach. There may be several senior staff members and directors from Cariad Pet Therapy, and on some occassions another dog. One person will take the lead with the assessment.

WHAT WOULD BE A FAIL?

The main reasons for a fail in the assessment are the dog jumping up onto strangers, mouthing, excessive licking of hands, not happy to meet new people, not being under control, excessive pulling on a lead, growling, or visible stress signals shown in their body language. If you do not appear to bond with your dog or you are unable to converse and talk about your dog this can be a reason for a fail. If your dog goes to toilet during the assessment - this can be seen unfavourably as we expect your dog to have been exercised beforehand and this may show a lack of awareness of your dogs needs.



What happens next if we pass the therapy dog assessment?

WE WILL TAKE YOUR ID PHOTOS

We will have an opportunity to take a photo of you and one of your dog for the ID card at the end of the successful assessment.

WE WILL INVITE YOU ONTO OUR APP

We use an online app for our onboarding and therapy dog procedures which can be accessed on your phone and/or your computer. This can be done with paper copies.

WE WILL ASK YOU TO COMPLETE YOUR ONBOARDING

This includes:

- Completing a registration form
- Formal online training on your role and responsibilities, with quiz
- Volunteer Code of Conduct
- Enhanced DBS check
- Safeguarding Training
- Confidentiality Training
- Dementia Training
- Clothing order
- ID badge
- Providing a copy of your dogs vaccination/titre test record
- Support Structure / Communications / Surveys / Feedback

REGISTRATION FEE & ID

There is a £20 registration fee payable before you receive your ID badge. This goes towards the cost of your ID and visit insurance. ID is valid for 1 year and yearly ID renewals are at no extra cost.

WHEN MY ONBORDING IS COMPLETED




